What's happened So Far

April 2015

75 people met to talk about what future they wanted for Wester Hailes. They set the agenda and agreed a plan.



June 2015

The Hunter Foundation visited Wester Hailes and asked how it could help support community action. Local organisations and residents formed a partnership and started planning.

August 2015

A follow up session gave people the chance to talk about the priorities in more detail.

October 2015

The local partnership sent in a proposal to the Hunter Foundation. They suggested setting up a Community Trust with a Community Fund.



December 2015

The Hunter Foundation agreed to give the Community Trust £65,000 a year for 3 years from the STV Children's Appeal.

February 2016

Local partners agreed how the new Community Trust will work. An application has now been sent to the Scottish Charity Regulator to set up the new Trust as a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation.

March 2016
