

Edinburgh Airport Draft Masterplan Consultation



Edinburgh Airport have launched a consultation of their draft masterplan.

Over the last 10 years, the number of passengers travelling through Edinburgh Airport has increased by 20%. It is anticipated that between 2015 and 2020 passenger numbers will increase by a further 18%, rising from 11.1 million in 2015 to 13.1 million in 2020.

The Masterplan will set out a vision for the future of the airport, and highlight the growth and development over the next few decades. Following the

consultation a finalised Masterplan will be published in 2017.

Gordon Macdonald MSP commented, "Edinburgh Airport is a massive benefit to Edinburgh in terms of jobs, the economy, and as a transportation link. However, we must ensure that its growth and expansion are responsible, and that residents' concerns are reflected in their plans. I would recommend that my constituents make their opinions known in the consultation."

Motorcycle Theft

Police in Edinburgh have launched a new operation dedicated to tackling motorbike theft and associated antisocial behaviour in the capital. Operation Soteria began with two days of enforcement activity in the city utilising a range of resources from across Police Scotland.

The perpetrators are mostly teenage youths who steal high performance motorcycles for the thrill, riding them in public places and often along pavements.

"Along with several other MSP colleagues from Edinburgh, I have signed a joint letter to the Lord Advocate and Justice Secretary requesting an investigation into the range of penalties that can be imposed on those who are stealing bikes and threatening residents."
