£1 Billion City Deal to Create 21,000 Jobs



Edinburgh is to benefit from a massive £1.1 billion City Deal that will result in thousands more people in employment.

The package, which also covers the wider Lothians region, will include £350 million to be invested in innovation, £65 million in new housing, £25 million in skills development, £120 million for a

flyover at the Sheriffhall roundabout, £20 million for roads in West Edinburgh, and £20 million for a new 1,000-seater concert hall off St Andrew Square.

The Scottish Governments is leading the investment by contributing £300 million with local councils, universities, and the UK Government also contributing to the project. It is anticipated that the deal will create around 21,000 jobs.

Gordon Macdonald MSP commented, "This is a good deal for Edinburgh and will ensure the continued prosperity and development of city and wider region. The deal will deliver infrastructure improvements, particularly around Edinburgh Pentlands and the west of Edinburgh, deliver jobs for thousands, and create economic growth for years to come."

The deal also includes a £35 million investment in the Edinburgh Centre for Robotics at Edinburgh and Heriott-Watt University. The funding will significantly expand the current multi-disciplinary team of more than 100 researchers.

Gordon noted, "The Scottish Government have ensured that this funding shall be directed towards developing jobs for the future. With this investment, Edinburgh will also become a hub for robotics and autonomous technologies."

Gordon Macdonald welcomes the development of 37 new affordable homes. The name "Calder Green" suggested for was the development to fit in with the local area. However, due to concerns that emergency service vehicles would have trouble distinguishing between similarly named streets another name has been chosen. Instead, the development will be named "Fernieflat Neuk" after a farm that was located in the north of what is now Baberton Mains.

The collection of 2- to 3-bed houses and flats will be available at a range of affordable to midmarket rents. The £3.33 million project is part of a wider council programme to contribute to the identified shortfall in demand for new homes in Edinburgh over the next 10 years.
