Save Our Schools



Edinburgh Council are proposing to close two secondary schools in Edinburgh Pentlands constituency: Currie Community High School and Wester Hailes Education Centre

Commenting, local MSP Gordon Macdonald noted, "These schools are the cornerstones of their

communities. The staff strive to get the best out of the pupils and the schools provide local leisure facilities and adult education classes.

"The Council attempts to justifies these closures by saying that there will be additional pupils in south west Edinburgh, that both schools are in poor condition, and that the WHEC has a small catchment area.

"However, it is known that Balerno is operating at 82% capacity, Currie at 77%, and the WHEC at 36% — there's enough room available, and no doubt some investment is required but, despite that, consulting engineers Will Rudd Davidson reported in 2015 that whilst defects were identified, these were deemed generally cosmetic and non-structural."

Gordon Macdonald MSP proposes that a similar replacement method as used at Forrester High instead: build the replacement on the grounds of the school and then demolish the existing buildings. There is scope for this on both sites and it would allow the two schools to remain at the heart of their communities. Concerns have also been raised regarding the viability of the Woodlands school that shares the campus and some of the facilities with the high school at Currie. The new site at Curriemuirend would also result in increased traffic on the Lanark Road.

Concluding, Gordon stated, "I will be campaigning for the two schools to remain on their existing campus and I would urge parents and all members of the community to take part in the consultation below."

More Teachers



SNP education funding has boosted teacher numbers across Edinburgh – part of an increase of 543 teachers across Scotland.

Teacher numbers in Edinburgh have risen from 3,213 to 3,281 – while the number across Scotland has increased substantially to 51,513 – 543 more than last year, with 666 full-time equivalent teachers being funded through the Attainment Scotland Fund, money that the Tories, Labour and Lib Dems voted against.

The SNP has made closing the attainment gap a key priority of this parliament.

£400 Million More to NHS



Despite Tory austerity, this year's SNP budget will fund NHS Scotland by an additional £400 million and slightly cut income tax for those earning less than £33,000. Only the highest earners will pay more.

Commenting, Gordon said, "Our actions will make Scotland the fairest taxed part of the UK. We will stop Tory cuts, invest in our NHS, protect our public services, and grow our economy.

"In fact, for the majority of taxpayers (55%), Scotland will be the lowest taxed part of the UK next year."
