Redford Barracks "Closure Plan"

Nuclear Convoys in Safety Incidents

June



It is seemingly still the intention of the UK Government to close Redford Barracks as part of a plan to close eight military bases in Scotland. The plan also includes the closure of nearby Craigiehall in Edinburgh and Glencourse in Penicuik.

Gordon Macdonald MSP has again recently contacted the UK defence minister, Gavin Williamson, urging him to rethink the future of Redford Barracks — especially given that a recent report by the National Audit Office had concluded that the closure plan did not deliver guaranteed savings.

Commenting, Gordon said, "The UK Government is displaying a complete disregard for the jobs and communities who depend on the base."

Gordon highlighted to the Defence Secretary that there has been little consultation or consideration for the communities involved and further requested that the MoD clarify their closure strategy and what they plan to do to support those affected.

Further commenting, Gordon emphasised that, "There needs to be a consideration of the economic and social impact of this decision. The Tories think they can do whatever they want to Scotland and get away with it — this seems to be less of an attempt to optimise the defence estate, as they claim, but simply a case of centralisation and asset stripping."

Eight times a year, an Army convoy carrying nuclear warheads and material use the Edinburgh bypass on route from Coulport, where the weapons are stored, to the Atomic Weapons plant in Berkshire, where they are maintained. Gordon spoke on this and the importance of community safety in Parliament.

Gordon Commenting, said, "People who live along the route have never been informed what to do in the event of an accident. It would likely require total evacuation of all west Edinburgh, including schools, two universities, and a college. The UK Government cannot even prepare for an accident.

"I have called for a ban on the convoys as a first step towards completely removing nuclear weapons from Scotland."

Schools Closure Update



The Council Education Committee met on 22 May to consider the responses to the consultation of the West & South West Schools Review. The meeting concluded more information was required.

The committee will publish a report on 15 June, ahead of the next committee on 21 June 2018, at which the decision will be made.

I have made it clear that they need to consider what will be left in Wester Hailes if the WHEC goes? There is only one community centre, Clovenstone — Calder community centre has closed, the Wood Centre has become a postal centre, and there are few play areas. If Wester Hailes loses the WHEC, they also lose a swimming pool, gym, adult education classes, and a place to host events.

As, I underlined in a recent Evening News article, I, and most of communities affected, have been clear that the bottom line is that the four schools — Balerno, Currie, Woodlands, and the WHEC must remain open and on their current sites. Only "Option 1" of the alternative options would see this happen.
