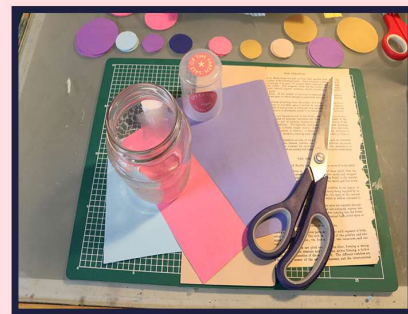


Recycled Paper Wall Hanging

Materials:

Scrap papers
Round things
Scissors
String
Thread
Tape
Wooden Stick
(I used a kebab skewer)

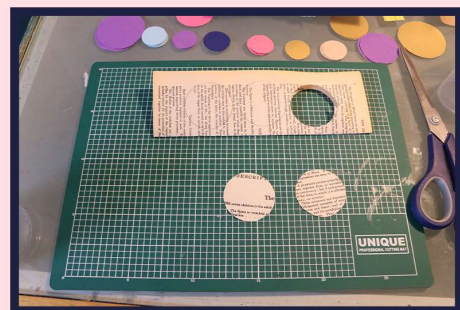


Step 1: Cut out your circles



1. Draw around something round
2. Fold the paper over
3. This way you can cut 2 circles the same time!

TIP: Use different colours and sizes
(I used a Jar and two different lids)

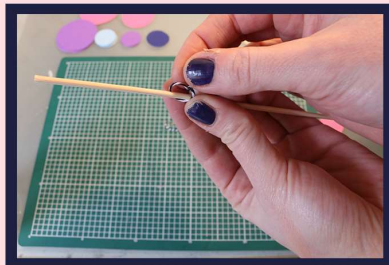




Step 2: Make your hanger



1. Cut a piece of string that is a bit longer than your stick/skewer
2. Tie on one end of the stick, about one inch from the end



3. Do the same thing on the other end
TIP: Make sure its a double know, and use some funky string/wool if you have any!

Step 3: Assemble

1. Arrange your circles in strips, in an order you like the look of. You can spend a while on this, or make it quite random!
2. Cut a piece of thread long enough for each strip of circles
3. Tape the thread down to your surface at both ends, so that the thread is running down the centre of the circles
4. Tape the thread to each circle, keeping the tape as centred as you can

TIP: Pre-cut some small pieces of masking tape to make the assembly easier

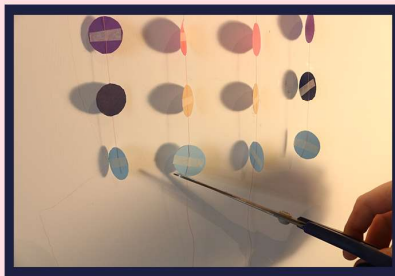


Step 4: Finishing touches



(HANG THE HANGER ON A WALL BEFORE YOU BEGIN)

1. Take your strips of circles and tie them to the hanger that you made earlier
2. Trim the bottom and top of the thread off



TIP: You can tie the strips on at different points if you want a less structured look!



Your wall hanging might look like this or it might look completely different! You can use different shapes or colours of paper. You could even paint your stick/skewer!
