This panel is celebration of community vision and achievement and links this to wider human successes. Both artistic and practical, it will act as a focus for social history walks and the promotion of active travel generally.

Throughout our history the Moon has been a symbol of aiming for unreachable goals, but on July 20, 1969, Neil Armstrong took 'one small step for a man, one giant leap for mankind' and for the first time humanity saw itself amongst the stars.

In this same year, the building of Wester Kailes began, and residents feel a sense of pride in sharing this date with such a special event in human history. We hope that this Moon can inspire wonder and contemplation during your time in Wester Kailes.

On the 31st Jan 2018 the Blue Moon was photographed above the nearby Westburn Woods by local resident Emily Stevenson and drawn in ink and designed by Nicola Atkinson of Beautiful Materials Design Studio, this reproduction produced in sandblasted granite paving and stainless steel for the Westside Plaza/ Making Places development makes reference to that rare event.

When you gaze at the Moon, how does it make you feel? Many will think of science and exploration, while others imagine goddesses and prayer, and some of us will dream of romance and poetry. Our nearest celestial neighbour inspires and influences all of us.
