

Cost of Living Crisis

Electric Vehicle Chargers Go Live



First Minister Nicola Sturgeon set out a raft of actions in the annual Programme for Government designed to help people through the cost of living crisis.

The package will include an increase in the Scottish Child Payment to £25 per eligible child per week from 14 November, with the ground-breaking anti-poverty benefit opening to applications for all eligible under-16s.

Gordon noted, "The Scottish Child Payment is unique to Scotland and is the most ambitious child poverty reduction measure in the UK. For eligible families in Edinburgh, this

payment will help mitigate the growing cost of living crisis. The payment was doubled to £20 per week per child in April and the further increase to £25 from November represents a 150% rise. Last year, 7,555 eligible children across Edinburgh benefited from the scheme, and no doubt a similar number will do so this year."

Unfortunately, the recent Westminster "mini-budget", which included lifting the cap on bankers' bonuses and tax cuts for the rich, has directly resulted in the pound plummeting to record lows, interest rates for borrowing soaring, and mortgage deals disappearing.

Gordon commented, "Here is a clear example of the Scottish Government working to alleviate poverty whilst the UK Government is pulling the rug from beneath people's feet.

"UK government reckless policies have been subjected to rebuke by the IMF and severe warnings from credit agencies. The UK economic crisis shows exactly why Scotland needs to become an independent country."



Gordon was pleased to welcome the installation of 141 new electric vehicle charging bays across the city over the summer, which includes 72 rapid and fast charging bays at on-street sites with the remainder located at Hermiston and Ingliston Park & Ride sites.

The project was funded by £2.3 million awarded through Transport Scotland's *Switched on Towns and Cities Challenge Fund*.

Gordon noted, "The additional provision of electric vehicle chargers funded by the Scottish Government will encourage and support the take-up of cleaner, low-emission electric vehicles. Transport contributes significantly to carbon emissions, and the sustainable switch more vehicles is essential to meeting the city's Net Zero target."
