

NEET FIGURES AT ALL TIME LOW

Recently published figures reveal that the number of young people aged 16-19 not in employment, education or training (NEET) in Scotland is at an all-time low.

The official NEET figure is at 16,270 - down from the previous year's figure of 19,970 and down from the 2003 total of 27,790. The rates of 16 -19 year olds who were NEET also decreased in 30 of the 32 local authority areas.

This follows the news that youth employment in Scotland is at a record high and the number of Modern Apprenticeships has increased by almost 60% since 2007.

Welcoming these findings, Gordon MacDonald MSP said: "With further powers over the economy, employment and social security the Scottish Parliament would be able to take action to strengthen our economy to enhance universities, world class strengthen the valued further education sector and create more and better paid jobs for young people."

Scotland's children must be given everything they need to fulfil their full potential in life and the Attainment Fund is an important step in the right direction. We aim to make Scotland the best country in the world in which to grow up."

Stop Nuisance Calls!



Gordon Macdonald visited Which's Calling Time roadshow, when it dropped in at Waverley Station, to pledge support for the campaign to help end nuisance calls and texts which has already attracted over 230,000 supporters.

An analysis of data from the Information Commissioner's Office shows there have been around 61,500 official complaints about nuisance calls and texts since December. With just 2% of people who receive unwanted calls reporting them to the regulator, it means millions more are still being received.

The Which campaign urges the UK Government and regulators to renew their efforts to help cut down on the number of nuisance calls and texts. It aims to make it easier for people to report unwanted calls with its new complaints webpage where people can log the details to help identify offenders.

Gordon said: "Many constituents are receiving these nuisance calls on a daily basis and people are sick of being bombarded with them especially as it is wasting their time and invading their privacy. I ask you to join the Which Calling Time on Nuisance Calls and Texts campaign"
