Firework Control Zones In Place For Bonfire Night



Edinburgh is significantly stepping up safety measures for Bonfire Night this year, employing both Firework Control Zones (FCZs) and Police Dispersal Zones to manage public order and reduce anti-social behaviour.

The City of Edinburgh Council has implemented nine Firework Control Zones (FCZs), making it a criminal offence to set off most consumer fireworks on both public and private property within these areas between October 31 and November 9, 2025. The nine FCZs are: Balerno, Calton Hill, Corstorphine, Gracemount, Longstone, Moredun, Niddrie, Seafield, and Sighthill. This measure, which carries a maximum penalty of a £5,000 fine or a six-month custodial sentence, aims to protect

communities, vulnerable residents, and animals - such as those at Edinburgh Zoo.

In direct response to public disorder incidents last year, Police Scotland has requested the introduction of four additional Dispersal Zones for the Bonfire Night period, supplementing the FCZs. The new and planned Dispersal Zones cover the areas of Oxgangs, Gorgie, Saughton and Sighthill.

Dispersal Zones grant police officers the power to instruct groups of two or more people who are congregating and behaving, or likely to behave, in an anti-social manner to disperse and leave the area for up to 24 hours. Refusal to comply can lead to arrest.

If you plan to celebrate Bonfire Night, residents are strongly encouraged to attend one of the many organised firework displays across the city, which are exempt from such bans.

Gordon joined a walkaround to preview the ambitious plans to transform the former Balerno Police Station into a community hub.


Emma Galloway, the Balerno Village Trust (BVT) chair and a leading player in the acquisition, showed the


